

Limb Difference: Traumatic Type: Missing Right Hand Sport: Basketball

Going into her senior year of high school in Southwest Michigan, Carley was diagnosed with a rare medical condition that landed her in the hospital for three and a half weeks. Carley underwent 15 surgeries, which eventually resulted in the amputation of her dominant right hand.

The amputation was not the end rather it was just the beginning. With her faith and determination Carley was back on the basketball court three short months after the loss of her hand. Carley's favorite memory of NubCamp was when she taught her basketball camper, Ella, how to put her hair in a ponytail one handed.

"Going into NubAbility, I thought I was going to be the one inspiring campers, but it was the campers who inspired ME! Each summer, I look forward to NubCamp and the relationships that are made with the campers, their families and other coaches."

Limb Difference: Traumatic Type: Missing Right Arm (Below Elbow) Sport: Basketball

When Zach was 11 years old, he was involved in a boating accident. Zach was standing on the dock holding the rope to keep the boat from floating off. When his grandmother's husband went to park the trailer, the end of the trailer caught the rope, which was was wrapped around Zach wrist. He was drug 30 yards, and the weight of the boat tore all of the ligaments from his hand to shoulder.

After being taken into surgery at Shands Hospital in Gainesville, it was determined that amputation was the best course of action due to severe nerve, tendon and ligament damage. Looking back and remembering the accident, Zach knows that losing his hand was a blessing. He is lucky to be alive.



Limb Difference: Traumatic Type: Missing Left Hand Sport: Archery, Basketball

When David was 2 years old, he had an accident at his family's bakery that resulted in the loss of his left hand. Growing up, he had to adaptive to tying his shoes, zippers, buttons, and every day tasks.

As a child, he would hunt with a crossbow alongside his family and spent lots of time at "deer camp." A few years ago, David got his wife a compound bow for her birthday. One day while shooting, he decided to give it a try and hit the target the first shot. He has not looked back since! David recently became the Archery Manager of 717 Armory where he gets to live his passion every day.

"When I arrived at the camp, it was overwhelming to be surrounded by so many other athletes who had limb-differences. It is not something I ever thought I would get to experience, which is why I am so happy to be a part of the Nub Family."
